CREATION STATION

Art for Inspiration, Community & Hope

Alice Klock, one member of the choreographic and performance duo known as FLOCK, alongside Florian Lochner, is slated to debut with Seattle Dance Collective as part of the *Continuum* program this summer. Not willing to let the physical constraints of the current pandemic stifle her desires for artistic enterprise and community support between now and then, she launched a new project known as "Creation Station" to allow artists to connect virtually via Instagram in order to motivate and inspire one another.

- Each week, Klock invites all artists to participate in a creative endeavor based on a specific prompt, which she delivers via an Instagram story. Two examples of Alice's prompts:
 - Think back on a moment in nature that you have had that felt transformative, magical, or informative in some way.
 - Create something that explores the last conversation that you had with a stranger.
- Artists of all skill levels-from novice to professional-are encouraged to participate via any artistic medium of their choosing.
- The weekly submissions must arrive in Alice's direct message inbox by Friday in order to be shared with the community via posts and stories over each weekend.



Q & A WITH ALICE

What inspired you to create this project?

Spending the last couple of years as a freelance choreographer, I have been fortunate to engage in many collaborations with amazing artistic minds. When all that came to a halt with the onset of Covid-19, I quickly realized how much I immediately missed the community element in my creative life. So, I decided to try and build a new community through my Instagram, offering a space in which artists do not feel they are creating in a void. Making art in difficult times is often one of the few things that we can do to give us a sense of purpose & create joy. I know that my mood has been elevated immensely by the submissions I have received!



My hope for this project is that artists of all levels and all disciplines will feel inspired to create, knowing that everyone can be an artist, with or without formal training. We are all beautifully creative beings. Sometimes, it is moments like these that allow people to really discover that about themselves.

Has anything surprised you since launching this project?


I have been surprised by the extent of the international response. At a time when borders are closing, I find it to be so profoundly beautiful that we are finding ways to connect on a global scale. It actually makes me really emotional and so grateful for the technology that allows us all to be connected in that way.

What are some of the submitted works that have really stood out to you?

The works where the artists really take the prompt seriously and put in obvious effort to create something really personal and fulfilling for them are the pieces that have really blown me away. It honestly has very little to do with the level of skill or training that the artist might have. When a creator really cares and invests in their work, the result is stunning. There are also a number of pieces that I have received from people in areas of the world that have been hit particularly hard with the virus. These really get to me emotionally. It is amazing to see the creative resilience of people.

Do you think that any of the work that has been created could be expanded into larger scale work/collaborations for public viewing once we are on the other side of this?

Yes, I do! I am already feeling that "Creation Station" is serving as something of a creative record of this time, and I would love to collaborate with many of the artists that I am getting to know in the future. Instagram is a limited format, and I would love to see more from many of these pieces!

DANCE IMMERSION WORKSHOPS

Once again, SDC offers a series of Dance Immersion Workshops during its residency on Vashon Island, designed for students with intermediate to advanced level experience to learn from SDC artists and experience the joy of this dynamic art form. Daily workshops begin with a conditioning class, followed by master dance classes in ballet technique and contemporary dance. Instructors will include SDC Artistic Directors Noelani Pantastico and James Yoichi Moore, plus additional artists from SDC, FLOCK and PNB.
